# eTwinning Project: Creating Open Educational Resources for Inclusive Digital Healthcare

Between March and June 2025, students from Turkey, Slovakia, and Croatia collaborated on the eTwinning project "Creating Open Educational Resources for Inclusive Digital Healthcare," part of the Erasmus+ INVITE initiative. The project aimed to raise awareness about inclusive digital healthcare and enhance students' digital competencies, focusing on the needs of elderly and disadvantaged individuals.

Turkish students produced a two-part podcast on the challenges seniors face using digital health apps. Slovak students created a video and activity introducing Continuous Glucose Monitoring (CGM) systems, while Croatian students developed a video promoting empathy toward older and disadvantaged groups.

Together, participants also contributed to an open educational resource for health vocational schools, including a digital dictionary and an educational game to reinforce key vocabulary.













### Steering committee meetings
