Bridging Generations Through Digital Awareness: Activities Within Our Second eTwinning Project

Throughout the school year, students and teachers participating in our eTwinning project have been actively involved in a variety of educational, creative, and socially responsible activities aimed at strengthening digital skills, international collaboration, and awareness of the challenges faced by older adults in the digital era.

At the beginning of the project, surveys were conducted among both students and teachers in order to explore their knowledge and awareness of eTwinning projects. Following this initial phase, students took part in creative activities by designing project logos and posters. The best designs were selected through an online voting survey, encouraging active participation and collaboration among all project partners.

As part of the introductory activities, students and teachers also uploaded presentation posts about themselves to the eTwinning platform, helping participants get to know each other and strengthening communication between schools from different countries..

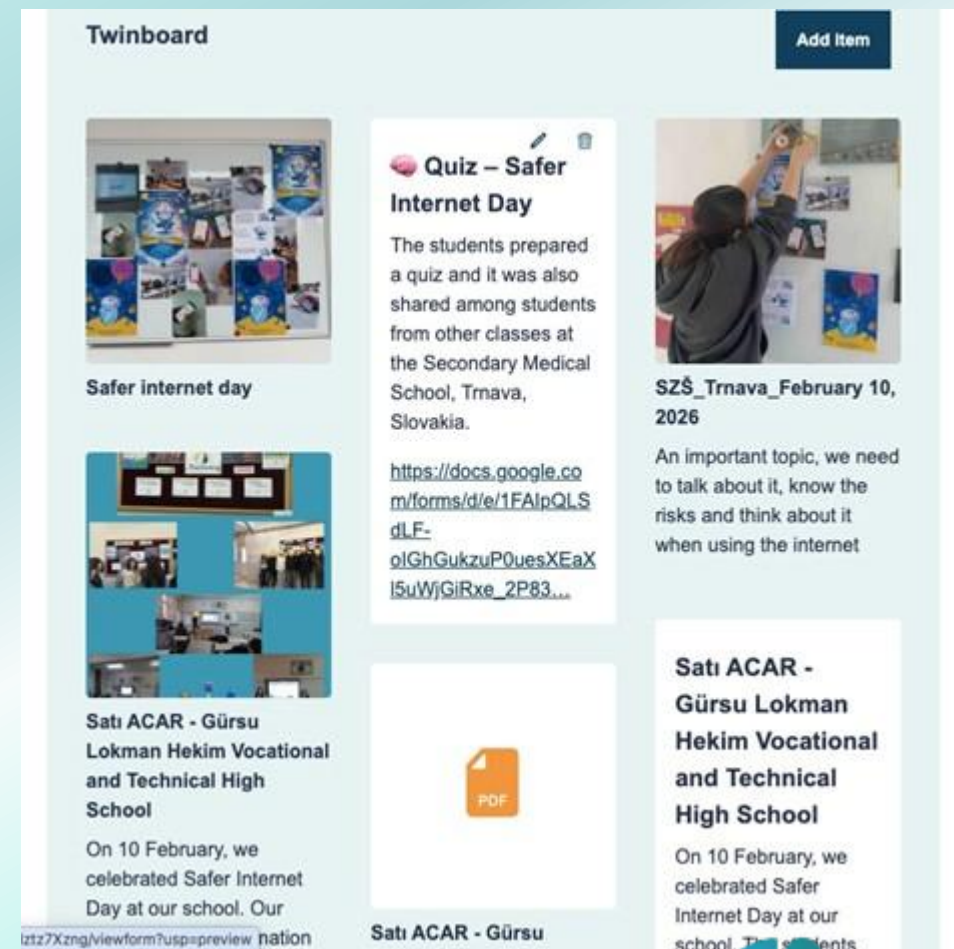

Special attention was given to **digital safety, responsible internet use, and the challenges older adults face in digitalization**. Students participated in Safer Internet Day activities, created e-safety games and posters, and explored common digital difficulties experienced by older people. During visits to nursing homes and hospitals, they discussed these challenges directly with older adults and provided practical support, strengthening their **digital literacy, empathy, patience and social responsibility**.

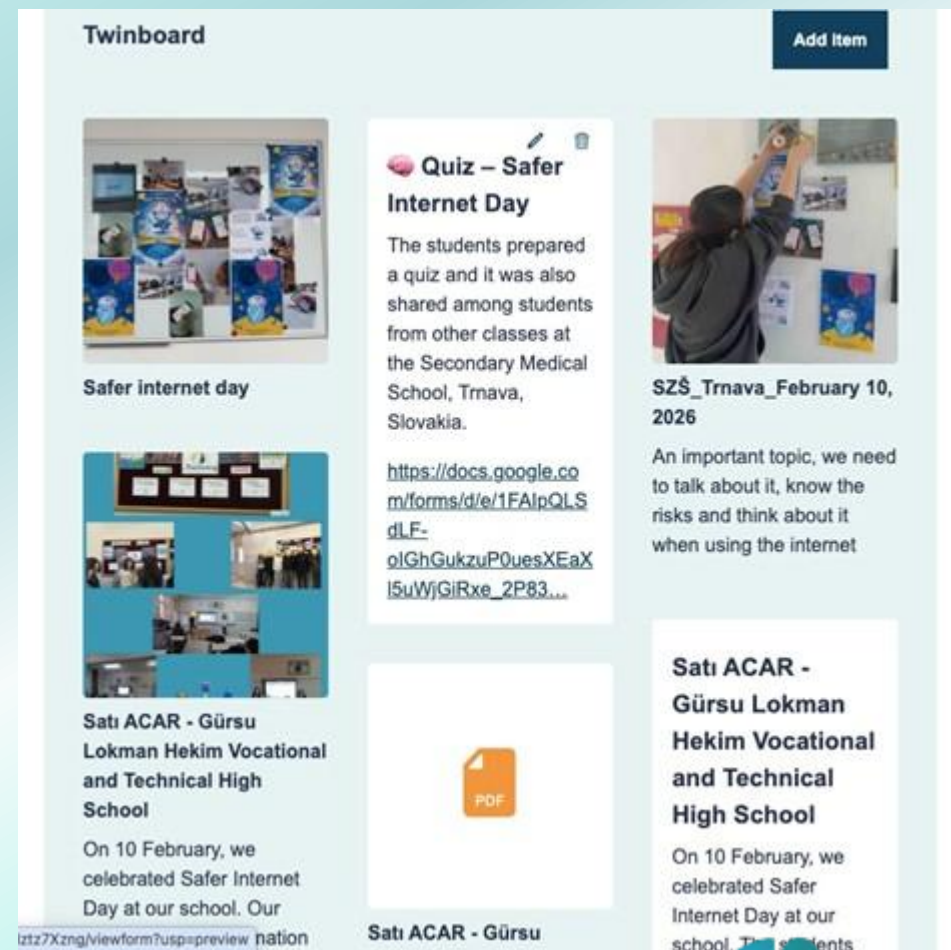

CONFERENCE “TELEMEDICINE , DIGITAL INNOVATION AND SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE OF HEALTHCARE” (UCCP)

One of the main highlights was the keynote presentation by Dr. Francesco Esposito from the Complex Primary Care Unit of Reventino, who explained the differences, applications, benefits, and limitations of teleassistance and telemedicine. Additional expert contributions were delivered by Eng. Michele Di Cello, representative of the Italian Society of Telemedicine (SIT), and Prof. Dr. Pietro Hiram Guzzi from the University “Magna Graecia” of Catanzaro.

The programme also included a practical demonstration of healthcare services delivered through telemedicine, followed by an interactive discussion and Q&A session with participants.

Held in English and attended by international participants, the conference reinforced the importance of European cooperation and innovation in shaping the future of digital healthcare.

The **INVITE conference**, held on **18 March 2026** by the Secondary Medical School, focused on digital transformation in healthcare education while emphasising the importance of **empathy, communication and patient-centred care**. The event brought together **more than 50 external participants** from healthcare, education and regional institutions, alongside students and school staff, and featured expert lectures, student presentations and discussions on the opportunities and challenges of digitalisation.

The conference connected **healthcare education, clinical practice and innovation**, addressing topics such as digitalisation, AI, robotics, digital pathology, diabetes care and physiotherapy. Special attention was given to the **INVITE project**, with students presenting their work on digital solutions, vulnerable groups and AI in healthcare. The event highlighted that technological innovation should complement, rather than replace, **empathy, human interaction and patient-centred care**, while strengthening cooperation between educational and healthcare institutions.

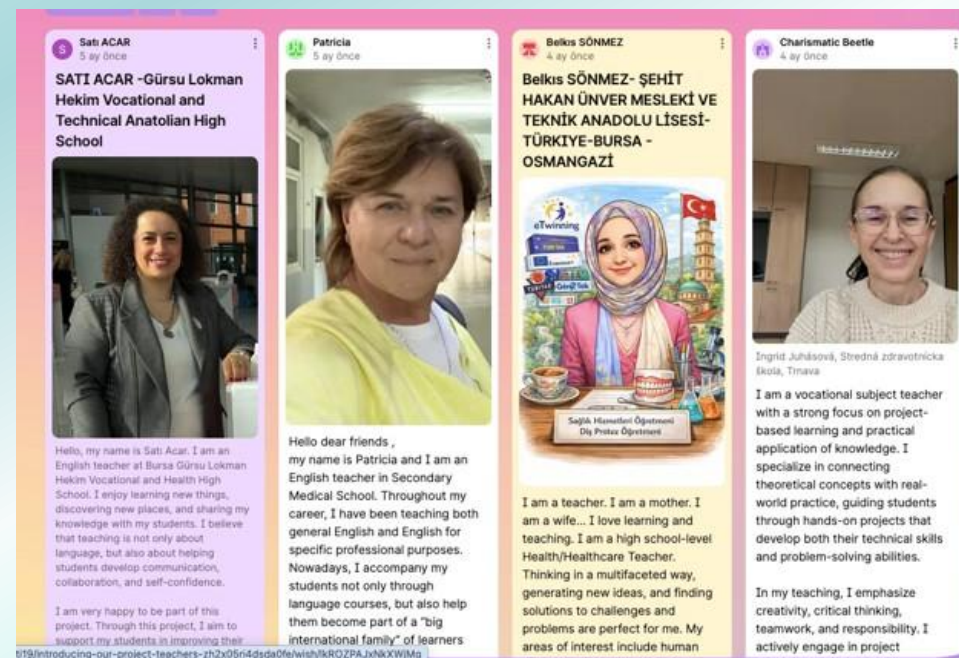
